Governance

Council and Committees

ARBS is governed by a Council comprising 12 members drawn from schemes and service providers and elected by the members. The Council is supported by 4 Committees, each charged with responsibility for mobilising efforts towards achievement of the strategic goals.

Strategic Plan

In September 2007 the Council adopted a 5-year Strategic Plan to chart the way forward for ARBS. This is the first formal strategic plan for ARBS and its development reflects the commitment of ARBS to the development of the retirement benefits industry in Kenya.
